Academics

Elton Collegiate has a graduation rate of 100% this year (32 out of a potential 32 grade 12's). This group of grade 12 students pictured here graduated on June 22nd, all with more credits than required. Some of them had credits numbering in the high thirties and some in the forty range.

A total of 977.5 out of 993.5 credits were completed by 114 students during the 2017-2018 school year. We had 15 distance credits earned and one student completed 8 apprenticeship credits.

Credit Completion Rate is 98.4%

TAG continues

Elton Collegiate continued with the TAG groups introduced in the 2015-16 school year. Our students are divided into 8 multi-graded homerooms that meet periodically throughout the year. The purpose of the meetings was to develop a safe and caring environment and sense of school sprit and belonging. Each team chose their team name and colour and earned points for their participation and knowledge of trivia. Events were organized by the promotions class and included things like dress-up days, fundraisers, games, etc. Prizes were awarded to the winning team every three months. Activities also included developing our beliefs about the kind of school we want to have and what are our bottom lines with regard to behaviour. Work in Control Theory Restitution and PAX will continue to be delivered through the TAG groups.

Literacy

The goal is to increase the number of students who achieve 70% OR BETTER in ELA on their report card.

Strategies

Differentiated instruction using vocabulary development strategies

Clearly articulated outcomes that are visible to students.

Build academic vocabulary in all content areas using graphic organizers.

Use of backward design for learning to develop unit and lesson plans complete with exemplars using the Inquiry Model.

Design an assessment plan that includes student choice and rubrics.

Routine monitoring of student work and student progress data and provide interventions.

Starting in the second semester we will use PLC groups for RTI and Sprints to improve teaching practices

Mental Wellness: Our goal is for 100% of our staff and students will have knowledge and understanding of mental health and wellness; including Control Theory, Restitution, Mindfulness and PAX.

Strategies

Staff and Students have been trained in Control Theory, Restitution and the Needs, and PAX.

Staff use the PAX kernels in there classrooms

Staff supervision has been increased to assist students with self-regulation strategies.

TAG groups continue to be used for school climate improvement, school spirit, and teaching of social responsibility.

Meaningful Roles was used to give students assets they may not have had otherwise.

Numeracy

The goal is to increase the number of students who achieve 70% OR BETTER in Mathematics on their report card.

(10 of 16) 63% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 11 and 12 Pre-Calculus Math.

(11 of 21) 52% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 11 and 12 Applied Math.

(17 of 30) 57% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 11 and 12 Essential Math.

(12 of 22) 55% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 10 Applied/Pre-CAL Math.

(18 of 24) 75% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 10 ESSENTIAL Math.

(18 of 33) 55% of Students Achieved 70% OR BETTER in Gr. 9 Math.

Strategies

Clearly articulated outcomes that are visible to students.

Build academic vocabulary using graphic organizers, where applicable.

Routine monitoring of student work and student progress data and provide interventions.

Encourage students to self-advocate and use the point of first mistake principle to analyze incorrect answers. Implement suggestions from Grade Group Meetings. Starting in the second semester we will use PLC groups for RTI and Sprints to improve teaching practices
